The following questions were received prior to the close of the Technical Question period on August 23, 2024, at 12:00 PM MST:

1. I wanted to check to see if you were looking for a rental or purchase or both. Also, which option would be preferred.
 - a. We would ideally like a proposal for both, vendors are welcome of course to submit one or the other if that is the only thing available to them at the time of submission. History wise we have rented.
2. Is this only going down once a year?
 - a. In a rental scenario it is just being used once a year, in a purchase scenario several times as it would be shared asset amongst the university.
3. Would you need a supervisor every year during May?
 - a. In a rental scenario yes – every year for install.
 - b. In purchase scenario it would be assumed 1 would be provided for just first year included in the cost of delivery.
4. Would this product only be down for 1 day or 10 days at a time?
 - a. See production schedule included within RFP, but typically it is between 7-10 days of time on the synthetic football field.
5. What is the weight capacity requirement for the modular flooring?
 - a. See product specifications for matrix heavy duty flooring – typically products in this class are capable of 400psi or better working ratings pending substrate, slightly lower ratings will be accepted if price point is superior and can be proven to meet university needs. Tractor trailer traffic, forklift traffic, 5000lb ballast blocks that are 4ft x 4ft and similar are typical load factors year over year.
6. Would you be having trucks, forklifts and blocks across the flooring over the synthetic football field?

5.2.2 Vendor to propose flooring protection for the purposes of assuring the quality and condition of the underlying football field and related surfaces are not damaged by the weight and or pressures of trucks, forklifts, ballast blocks or other production materials, for a period not less than seven days but in some instances as many as ten days of constant use.

 - a. Yes, see above and RFP specifications that is the purpose it must be heavy duty in nature and not a lightweight pedestrian like product.
